

WHERE DID SUMMER GO?



The Arrowhead Fourth of July picnic was a great success and would not be what it is without community support and celebration. This community is a big part of what makes Arrowhead a great place to be! The Arrowhead Fire Department would like to thank everyone involved. Much work goes into the preparation of this event and the fire department would like to specifically thank Billie Ellis and the kitchen crew for preparing and serving the food, Joanie Aufderheide for organizing the booths, Gary and Debbie Dietmeyer for organizing and leading the children's games, Kevin Stilley for the horseshoe tournament, Becky Stilley for announcements, and the many other volunteers that made this event possible.

The fire department is anxiously awaiting the delivery of fire equipment to replace the mattrack-mounted fire engine. The fire protection district has purchased a 2011 Prinoth Trooper snowcat. At the time of this writing the snowcat has been transported to Prinoth's Grand Junction facility and is undergoing the final maintenance inspections before delivery. A slip-on pump unit that will be used for both the snowcat and to supply a second fire engine for Arrowhead during the summer months is being assembled at Feld Fire's Iowa facility and should be ready for shipment any day. Upon the arrival of this equipment, the fire department will be busy making the final detailed modifications. We are in hopes of displaying this equipment to all of the community members at the fall pancake breakfast (to be announced).

Finally, "The Gunnison BOCC passed resolution 2012-22 Tuesday morning taking Gunnison County out of Stage 1 fire restrictions.

Effective at 12:00 noon Jul 31, we will no longer be under any fire restrictions."

The fire department would like to thank everyone for their patience and understanding during this spring/summer drought period and enacted fire restrictions. The conditions were right to produce an urban interface fire had an ignition source been provided. Thanks to YOU, this did not occur.

Please remember to continue to use good judgment and be safe with your outdoor fires throughout the summer.

Fire Pits: We are now allowed open fires in approved fire pits. With that notice given, Security was overwhelmed issuing new fire pit permits and recertifying existing fire pits, which is required annually. We are also changing the name from "Fire Pit Permits" to "Open Fire Permits"; this will include fire pits constructed with rocks, bricks, lined with concrete, mortar or steel, as well as the chiminea type manufactured fire enclosures. **Smoking Outdoors:** It has been reported to Security by people walking on our filing roads, that many cigarette butts have been found alongside of the filing roads and driveways. Just because we're having damp weather lately, please extinguish your cigarette butts in your ashtray while driving in your vehicle and when walking. In the military we call it "Field Stripping" your cigarettes by separating the burned tobacco from the filter, step on the hot tobacco tip and put the remaining filter residue into your pocket. Let's use some common sense here and keep our community safe from grass fires and keep our filing roads clean!

Filing Road Traffic: I am reposting my article concerning underage driving that was in the last issue of the Smoke Signals!- (see next page) Apparently some property owners are not getting it. They let their kids drive in our subdivision without any supervision. These young drivers drive recklessly, too fast and put "doughnuts and rooster tail" marks on our roads. We have identified these violators thanks to some aware property owners filing an official complaint against the violators. Please help our Security team by reporting any infractions to us immediately so we can take the proper actions.

Fishing at the Flint Lakes: Enjoy your fishing at the Flint Lakes. They were stocked with fresh fish on June 26^{th.} Fishing permits can be obtained from Security. Please be aware that the Flint Lakes are on private property and that this property is home to horses. The lakes are a "pack in-pack out" area which means that you are required to take all your trash home with you! This includes all fishing equipment such as line, hooks, bobbers, live bait and lures. These discarded items are harmful to the horses and wildlife that call the Flint Lakes their home. Another reminder is the lake's three (3) fish limit and that it is not allowed to clean any fish at the lakes. The reason for this is that it attracts predators such as bears, mountain lions and coyotes. Please be responsible neighbors!

SECURITY'S MESSAGE FROM JUN/JUL SMOKE SIGNALS


"Now that the filing roads are open, we will experience heavy traffic again and we need to remind our property owners and their guests to follow our rules and regulations. The AIA Board adopted the following regulation on under age drivers at the September 18, 2010 AIA Meeting, which states:

"No person under the age of ten years may operate an off-highway vehicle within the boundaries of the Arrowhead in Gunnison Country subdivision. No person ten years of age or older may operate an off-highway vehicle within the boundaries of the Arrowhead in Gunnison Country Subdivision, unless:

- 1. The person has in his possession a valid driver's license issued by the State of Colorado or another state; or
- 2. The person is accompanied by and under the immediate supervision of a person who has in his possession valid drivers' license issued by the State of Colorado or another state. The phrase "under immediate supervision" shall mean that, at a minimum, the unlicensed operator is within direct visual contact of the licensed supervisor."

If Security observes vehicles going too fast above the posted speed limit (20 mph), especially ATV's, expect to be pulled over and given a warning first, but repeated offenders will receive a non-compliance citation in the amount of \$50. During dry weather conditions the filing roads are very dusty, so if you are creating a large amount of dust behind your vehicle, <u>you are going too fast!</u> Please show respect by slowing down when you are approaching pedestrians, pets or bicyclists."

This year the John Krall Award was presented to three people, one couple and one individual.

"This Arrowhead couple have been longtime volunteers in many areas of our community.

"This couple has put in many hours volunteering with the Arrowhead Volunteer Fire Department. They are both active First Responders, tirelessly attend all required training and meetings so they can provide trained assistance during a medical emergency on the mountain.

They are also active fundraisers for our fire department, organizing and running the AVFD Picnic's Silent Auction.

They have been active organizers of the social side of the AVFD, as well. Who can forget the reminders at each AVFD Business meeting for the next potluck and the next Super Potluck? A space for her announcement was always left on the secretary's notes of the minutes.

The Pancake Breakfast was another place where you'd see this couple. If anything needed to be done- you were sure to find both of them there to quietly get it done- from setting up chairs to wiping tables and sweeping floors.

They constructed the AVFD Mitigation wildfire demos, many times over. The visual demonstration they provided was worth a thousand words.

She stepped in to help lead the AIA Long Range Planning Committee to poll our community on their wants and needs, polling, collecting, counting and presenting the findings to the AIA Board. Her work helped in the consideration of future improvements to our community.

They gladly stepped up two years ago to head the Community Clean Ups. They not only organize four clean-ups a year, but even when there is a small turn out- he, with his work gloves, muscle and trailer and she, wielding a fierce pair of nippers, can be seen from before the clean up starts until the very last volunteer has left. Oh- and there is always a smile and thank you that go with it!

This couple does all of this and more with a quiet perseverance that is admirable. So much of their work is behind the scenes that their contributions are often overlooked. When she is recognized publically, she turns red, defers the compliment and points out all the other folk who have helped.

Their love for our community and their neighbors is not shown by beating their chests for self recognition, but in their dogged dedication to the things that need to get done for all of us- whether it is helping clean up and beautify Arrowhead or making sure that there is an ongoing sense of collegiality and caring at community events. Just last month I saw him stand and introduce some new community members, the Hausers, to all at an AVFD meeting. All I could think was how very kind and caring an act that was... and that we could all learn from that tiny gesture."

This year the John Krall Award was presented to three people, one couple and one individual.

"This person has a long history volunteering in ordinary and extraordinary ways for our community. In fact, this is a history that is every bit as long as this person has lived here.

This person is known to every member of Arrowhead, if only by name, as his name has graced our website for years as well as a many issues of the Smoke Signals. One notable thing that this person shares with others we have honored with the John Krall Award, is the obvious willingness to step forward to fill places and positions that others felt were daunting, and to do this not for any self acclaim, but because, gee- it just needed to be done!

The following is taken directly from one of the nominations submitted for this deserving individual:

" He served as the AVFD chief for three years, during which time he expanded training to ensure cross training of all AVFD personnel. He was fully supportive of medical first responder training.

He was responsible for acquiring the new fire truck in 2009.

During his tenure he was instrumental in acquiring, implementing and personally installing AED's throughout the subdivision.

He regularly attends community meetings in Gunnison for the fire protection district.

He has participated in various training activities, including ice training certification at Blue Mesa, Colorado Fire Camp Wildfire and pack certification, and First Responder Certification, all of which benefit our community.

He is president of the Arrowhead Fire protection District and is responsible for reports, communicating with DOLA, special district renewals and resolutions and following up on grants, as well as inventorying and documenting equipment and assets as required by the special district.

He helped establish by-laws for the AFPD, reviewed recommended modifications and executed a new AFPD lease with AIA for the Firehouse.

After the red fire truck was destroyed by fire, he followed up with the claim to obtain an insurance settlement, leading to a replacement vehicle.

He has been responsible for the organization of the July 4th picnic on several occasions.

He spent two volunteer days helping Donnie Squirrell to find spring water company leaks in 2011.

He has volunteered countless hours to help with beetle kill prevention. Last year he worked 5-7 full days cutting beetle kill trees on common ground and hosted all workers for daily lunch. He also installed over 1200 MCH packs on common ground last year and is working on up to 750 this year as I write this.

All this for no salary and at personal expense of time and materials, and with that stupid smile on his face.""


Who IS this John Krall anyway?

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


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


